Ps 100

This Psalm is referred to as one of the "Millennium Psalms"

The psalm is organized around seven imperatives:

Make, Serve, Come, Know, Enter, Be, Bless

(Vs 1) Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all ye lands.

Regardless of musical talent,

We all are called to make a joyful noise.

(Vs 2) Serve the LORD with gladness: (ie. a willing heart);

We have a duty to serve God, but to do so gladly

come before His presence with singing.

We are to use our creative talents to worship our great God in songs of praise.

(Vs 3) Know ye that the LORD he is God:

Whether Jehovah of the Old Testament or Jesus of the New, He is God.

it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves;

Only God can create out of nothing.

Sing Praise unto The LORD, our Master by right of creation. (Ps 24:1)

We are His people,

Sing Praise unto The LORD, our Master by Right of Salvation.

and the sheep of His pasture.

Sing Praise unto The LORD, our Master by Right of Provision.

(Jn 10:27)(Ps 23)

(Vs 4) Enter into his gates with thanksgiving,

As the OT people of God entered the Temple, they were instructed to do so with thanksgiving.

and into his courts with praise:

As we come into the presence of the Lord, it is to be with praise.

be thankful unto him,

Gratitude: ~ An emotion of the heart, Recognizing a blessing received;

and bless His name.

for who He is & all that He does in caring for His own,

(Vs 5) For (B/C) the LORD is good;

(1) He is good!

His mercy is everlasting;

(2) His mercy is eternal, without end; It endureth forever, praise God!

and his truth endureth to all generations.

(3) His truth continues to all generations. (Matt 24:35)
